

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

The Nicene Creed

The Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you.

Lord God of our Fathers and Mothers; God of Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob and Rachel and Leah; God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us. Deliver us from the presumption of coming to this Table for solace only, and not for strength; for pardon only, and not for renewal. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.

The Communion of the People

The Holy Eucharist is open to all who seek a deeper relationship with God. To receive the Sacrament, either bread and wine, or bread alone – come forward and stand or kneel at the rail. You may also come forward for a blessing – simply fold your arms across your chest. Gluten-free wafers are available at communion. At the communion rail, mention your need for a gluten-free wafer to the Eucharistic minister. As you return, please make use of the side aisles.

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Holy Communion. Those worshiping virtually are invited to say the following prayer while communion is being distributed to the in-person gathering :

✠Jesus, we believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, and we desire to offer you praise and thanksgiving as we proclaim your resurrection. Loving you above all things, we long to be united to you in love. Since we cannot receive you in the Sacrament of your Body and Blood, come spiritually into our hearts. Cleanse and strengthen us with your grace, Lord Jesus, and let us never be separated from you. May we live in you, and you in us, in this life and in the life to come. Amen.
