First, let me thank all of you for your professionalism and caring for our entire Bulldog Family during the past 10 days. Bulldog Pride has never been more evident and more needed. I thank you all for your individual commitment to the larger common good.

As of March 15, many Texas agencies and municipal governments have established social distancing and visiting restrictions per CDC guidelines. These include restricting gatherings to no more than 10 people together in a public setting in order to slow the threat of local and regional exposure of Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Navarro College's Leadership Team, faculty, staff, education and community partners have been in communication for many days working on a transition plan for completion of the spring 2020 semester. Navarro College serves a diverse group of stakeholders and a variety of educational, workforce and socioeconomic needs, outcomes and expectations. Each of those needs, outcomes and expectations are important to Navarro College and have been carefully deliberated while working on our transition plan.

In our efforts to enhance social distancing and respond to federal, state and local recommendations/regulations to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic; to create and maintain a safe living and learning environment for each member of our Bulldog Family; and to do our part to protect the health of our region and those who may be especially vulnerable to this highly contagious virus, the following list contains Navarro College's next steps:

- Effective March 23 until April 13, instructional activities and faculty office hours will utilize virtual (online) platforms. This means face-to-face lectures, seminars, labs and other classroom settings, as possible, will take place virtually. *Please be aware this period may be extended based on continued developments of federal and/or state authorizations.* See FAQ's -Attending Classes on line [here](#).
