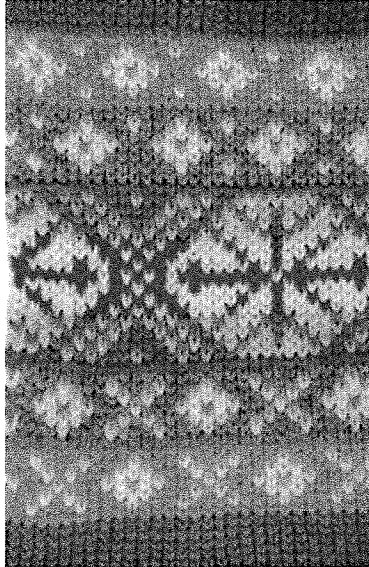


Introduction to Fair Isle Knitting with Julia Farwell-Clay \$40 March 4 - 1 to 4 PM

I love Fair Isle, but a lot of knitters think it's hard to do. They worry about choosing the right colors, they worry about tight tension choking their work, and they wonder how charts will look when they are finished.

In this class, we are going to talk about all of those things and more. We'll review color basics, try out different ways to hold yarn for stranding work, and knit a small project you can take home with pride. Even if you've never used double pointed needles, this is your chance to try them out. And at the end of class, as a special bonus, I'll cut my own knitting to show you a real life steek.
