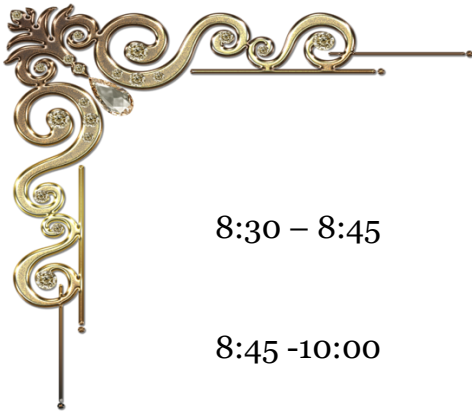

-  2007, Latasha Norman, (20) murdered by boyfriend (CNN Special), Washington County
-  2009, 16-year-old murdered by boyfriend after receiving death threat text messages, Sunflower, County.
-  2010, 15-year-old received text messages from boyfriend who threatened to kill her. School intervenes. Girl lives... Bolivar County.
-  2010, murder/suicide, 17-year-old killed by boyfriend, then commits suicide, Leflore County
-  2012, Shelby Harmon, run over by truck driven by her boyfriend, and two other vehicles, Bolivar County.
-  2015, boyfriend charged with capital murder in

the slashing death of his 27-year-old girlfriend, Leflore County

-  2016, boyfriend kills teen girlfriend, Sunflower County
-  2016, college student (female) raped by 3 male students off campus, Leflore County

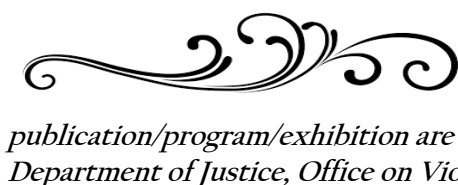
