THE PHARMACIST eCARE PLAN

A Pharmacist Care Plan is a document detailing a patient's current medication regimen and health concerns, including drug therapy problems and medication support needs, in addition to the pharmacy's interventions and the patient's health outcomes over time.

Being able to efficiently and effectively create and share care plans with healthcare providers and payers operating outside of pharmacy is crucial to the success of pharmacy's practice transformation. Electronically sharing a pharmacist-created Care Plan needs to meet existing standards adopted by medical providers sharing electronic medical records.

The Pharmacist eCare Plan contains the latest clinical data for a given patient. It is not a platform. It is not a clinical documentation system. It is a data repository and transmission standard.
