Aloha my Siblings in Christ,

Beginning in 2015, the Diocese of Hawai'i began setting aside Trinity Sunday of every year as a time to collect a special offering to support Camp Mokule'ia. This year, Trinity Sunday is on May 31st, and I write to encourage you to use this opportunity to support this valuable ministry of the Diocese.

Your financial support at this time would be a particular blessing to our Camp following the heavy rains and flooding this past March. While much has been done, there is still more work to do for a full recovery. The pool has been cleaned, and so it is back up and running. Sink holes have been filled. The Oregon-based company that maintains the ropes course is scheduled to be on island at the end of May to make repairs to our challenge course and zip line. The rebuilding of the tentalos are almost complete. There is still much to be done for summer camp and the future.

The insurance company has been very cooperative, but after the claims are settled, the Camp will still be short \$25,000.00 - \$30,000 for full recovery.

I hope every congregation will dedicate the loose plate offering to and welcome a special collection for the Camp on Trinity Sunday, May 31, 2026. Bea and I are committing \$500 to the Trinity Sunday collection this year. I hope every Episcopalian in the Diocese will make a donation this year. Your support is needed!
