

THE PRESENTATION *The Bishop and People sit.*

A Priest and a Lay Person, and additional presenters, standing before the bishop, present the first Ordinand saying,

Robert, Bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of Hawai'i, we present to you Priscilla Kalanikauikaalaneo Holokai to be ordained a deacon in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Has she been selected in accordance with the canons of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

We certify to you that she has satisfied the requirements of the canons, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.

The Bishop says to the Ordinand

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

The Ordinand answers

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church.

The Ordinand then signs the above Declaration in the sight of all present.

All stand. The Bishop says to the People

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Kalani for ordination to the sacred order of deacons.

Therefore if any of you know any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

If no objection is made, the Bishop continues

Is it your will that Kalani be ordained a deacon?

The People respond in these or other words

It is.

Bishop

Will you uphold Kalani in this ministry?

The People respond in these or other words

We will.

The Bishop then calls the people to prayer with these or similar words

For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord.
Lord, hear our prayer.

For those who do not yet believe, and for those who have lost their faith, that they may receive the light of the Gospel, we pray to you, O Lord.

For the peace of the world, that a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among nations and peoples, we pray to you, O Lord.

THE SERMON

The Rt. Rev. Robert L. Fitzpatrick, Bishop of Hawai'i

THE NICENE CREED *Please stand.*

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,

THE EXAMINATION

All are seated except the Ordinand, who stands before the Bishop.

The Bishop addresses the Ordinand as follows

My sister, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ, serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood directly under your bishop. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely. As a deacon in the Church, you are to study the Holy Scriptures, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them. You are to make Christ and his redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship. You are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world. You are to assist the bishop and priests in public worship and in the ministration of God's Word and Sacraments, and you are to carry out other duties assigned to you from time to time. At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself.

Bishop

Kalani, my sister, do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to the life and work of a deacon?

Answer

I believe I am so called.

Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

I do.

Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

I will.

Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures?

I will.

Will you look for Christ in all others, being ready to help and serve those in need?

I will.

Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to all people?

I will.

Will you in all things seek not your glory but the glory of the Lord Christ?

I will.

May the Lord by his grace uphold you in the service he lays upon you.

Amen.

All now stand. The Ordinand faces the Bishop.

A period of silent prayer follows, the people still standing.

The Bishop then says this Prayer of Consecration

O God, most merciful Father, we praise you for sending your Son Jesus Christ, who took on himself the form of a servant, and humbled himself, becoming obedient even to death on the cross. We praise you that you have highly exalted him, and made him Lord of all; and that, through him, we know that whoever would be great must be servant of all. We praise you for the many ministries in your Church, and for calling this your servant to the order of deacons.

Here the Bishop lays hands upon the head of the Ordinand, and prays

Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to Kalani; fill her with grace and power, and make her a deacon in your Church.

The Bishop continues

Make her, O Lord, modest and humble, strong and constant, to observe the discipline of Christ. Let her life and teaching so reflect your commandments, that through her many may come to know you and love you. As your Son came not to be served but to serve, may this deacon share in Christ's service, and come to the unending glory of him who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

The People in a loud voice respond

Amen.

The new deacon is now vested according to the order of deacons.

The Bishop then gives a Bible to the newly ordained, saying

Receive this Bible as the sign of your authority to proclaim God's Word and to assist in the ministration of his holy Sacraments.






