Bishop My fellow workers, each of you has been called by God to a special ministry of servanthood directly under your bishop. And so I ask: Will you continue to study the Holy Scriptures, to seek nourishments from them and to model your life upon them?

Bishop Will you continue to make Christ's redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship?

Deacons I will with God's help.

The Deacons are seated.

The Priests stand as able. The Bishop addresses the Priests.

Bishop My colleagues, each of you has been called by God to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church. And so I ask: Will you continue to proclaim, by word and deed, the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

Bishop Will you continue to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts?

Bishop Will you continue to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for the young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor?

Bishop Will you continue to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in celebrations of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform other ministrations entrusted to you?

Priests I will, with God's help.

Bishop Will you continue to nourish Christ's from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and the life to come?

Priests I will, with God's help.

All Clergy stand as able. A Lay Person addresses the Bishop and Clergy.

Lay Person Dear friends in Christ, each of you is called to be a faithful servant for the ministry of God's Word and Sacraments. And so I ask: Will each of you continue to be to us an effective example in word and action, in love and patience, and in holiness of life?

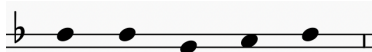

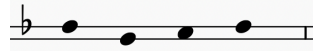



THE BLESSING OF OILS

Please remain standing.

Facing the people, the Bishop addresses them

Dear Friends in Christ: In the beginning, the Spirit of God hovered over the creation; and, throughout history, God, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, has empowered his people to serve him. As a sign of that gift, the priests and kings of Israel were anointed with oil; and our Lord Jesus was himself anointed with the Holy Spirit at his Baptism as the Christ, God's own Messiah. At Baptism, Christians are likewise anointed by that same Spirit to empower them for God's service. In the first centuries of the Church, the catechumens were also anointed with oil in prayer that their minds and hearts might be opened to the Holy Spirit as they prepared for Baptism. From the earliest days of the Apostles, when someone was ill, the elders were called to pray over the sick and to anoint the person with oil in the name of Jesus Christ. Let us now set apart these oils to be the signs of anointing within Christ's Church.

Bishop Let us pray.

Consecration of Chrism

The Bishop places a hand on the vessel of oil being consecrated as Chrism and prays

Eternal Father, whose blessed Son was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be the Savior and servant of all, we pray you to consecrate this oil, that those who are sealed with it may share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Oil of the Catechumens

The Bishop then places a hand on the vessel of oil being blessed to anoint catechumens and prays

Almighty God, protector of all who believe in you, bless this oil and give wisdom and strength to all who are anointed with it in preparation for their baptism; bring them a deeper understanding of the gospel, help them to accept the challenge of discipleship, lead them to the joy of life in Christ's holy fellowship, and keep them constant in worship of you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit; for you live and reign, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Oil of the Sick

The Bishop then places a hand on the vessel of oil being blessed to anoint the sick and prays

Blessed are you, O God, source of life and health. In Jesus you became flesh and came to know the depth of human suffering. You sent the disciples to heal those who were sick. Sanctify this oil that all who are anointed with it may be healed, strengthened, and renewed, by the power of your Holy Spirit. **Amen.**
