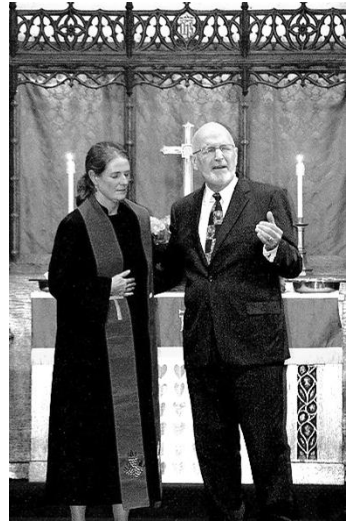
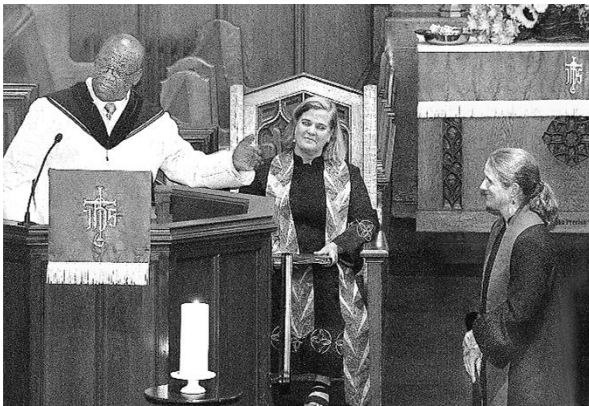


A WORD OF GRATITUDE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF PASTOR AMY CLARK FELDMAN

Over the past couple of years, since our 2018 trip, Nicaragua has experienced great political unrest and the country has suffered.
