PRAYER GROUP: 7:30 – 8:15 a.m.

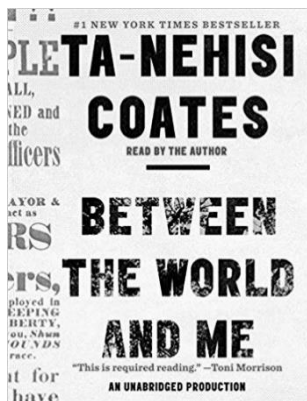
