



Process for Identifying Chapter Champion and Flight Winners 2026

The Chapter Championship will be contested over two dates. The tournament will be held Saturday, June 27 and Sunday, July 19 at our home course, Haggins Oaks Mackenzie Course. Competitors may play in one or both dates. Any Chapter member in good standing, with an established handicap, may compete.

FLIGHTS

The Flights will be determined on July 17. (This allows for flights to be determined based on registration breakdown over both rounds.)

HANDICAPS

Both dates will utilize the June 26 handicap revision.

CHAPTER CHAMPION

The Chapter Champion is low gross on either 18 hole round. (If a competitor plays both rounds, the lowest gross round will be used for scoring.)

In the event of a tie, the following procedure will be utilized:

- a) If all tied competitors are present at the June 1 round, an on course playoff will determine the Champion.
- b) If all tied competitors are not present at the June 1 round, the scorecard from the tying round will be utilized for a scorecard playoff following the USGA recommended method for matching scorecards. (See: Committee Procedures Section 5a(6) in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf.)

NET CHAPTER CHAMPION

The Net Chapter Champion is low net on either 18 hole round. (If a competitor plays both rounds, the lowest net round will be used for scoring.)

In the event of a tie, the following procedure will be utilized:

- a) For all tied competitors, the scorecard from in the tying round will be utilized for a scorecard playoff following the USGA recommended method for matching scorecards. (See: Committee Procedures Section 5a(6) in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf.)

FLIGHT LOW GROSS AND LOW NET

Once the flights have been determined, each flight will have a low gross and low net winner. The score from the best 18 hole round of any competitor will be used to determine scores.

In the event of a tie, the following procedure will be utilized:

- a) For all tied competitors, the scorecard from in the tying round will be utilized for a scorecard playoff following the USGA recommended method for matching scorecards. (See: Committee Procedures Section 5a(6) in the Official Guide to the Rules of Golf.)
