



Process for Qualifying for the 2022 Cal Cup Team

The LPGA Amateur California Cup (Cal Cup) Tournament has been held annually in the month of May open to all LPGA Amateurs California Chapters. It is a two-day match play tournament playing Foursome, Fourball and Individual formats. Due to registration deadlines and sufficient time for the team to practice, the 2022 team will be identified by the end of December 2021 of the year prior to the event.

Qualifying Process

The Cal Cup Tournament Team (12 players) will be identified using the following eligibility criteria:

- To be eligible to register at the stroke play qualifiers, member must have participated in the Match Play League and played at least one of the five league dates.
- Play in one (or both) of the two stroke play qualifiers scheduled on October 17 and November 14 at Haggin Oaks MacKenzie course

Five (5) team members will be identified from each of the stroke play qualifiers consisting of three (3) lowest net players and two (2) lowest gross players (total of 10 players). A Captain is selected by the 10 members “making the cut”. The 11th and 12th members of the team are reserved for the Captain’s picks. Any LPGA Amateurs Sacramento member who participated in the Match Play League and attempted to qualify at one of the stroke play qualifiers can be considered by the Captain. The Captain selects two picks to complement the other 10 team players in skills and handicap indexes.

Cal Cup Selection Information and Criteria

Cal Cup Chapter Qualifiers:	October 17, 2021 (same day of the final Stableford League) November 14, 2021
Location:	Haggin Oaks Golf Course – MacKenzie Course
Team Composition:	12 players

Participant’s Financial Obligations

It is anticipated that the 2022 Cal Cup Tournament will be held somewhere in Northern California, eliminating the need for lodging and air travel. However, we have not yet received notification of the specific course. Registration for the statewide two-day event is approximately \$350.

Handicaps

- Per Cal Cup policy, the maximum allowable handicap index for a team member is 32. There are limitations to handicap spreads in the Foursome team format.
