



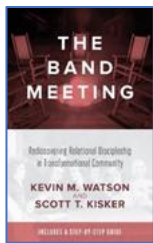

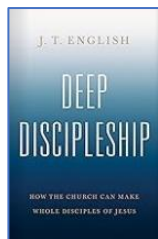


BAND MEETING: REDISCOVERING RELATIONAL DISCIPLESHIP IN TRANSFORMATIONAL COMMUNITY (102174) Author: Watson, Kevin and Kisker, Scott. In this eight-session DVD study, Kevin Watson and Scott Kisker explore the richness of Methodist band meetings. Similar to, but working on a deeper level than, a class meeting, a band meeting is a group of three to five people that is divided by gender, where the focus of each meeting is on confession of sin in order to grow in holiness. Sessions: 1) Banding together again (9 min.); 2) Creation, light, order, and abundant life (11 min.); 3) Salvation in the Wesleyan tradition (10 min.); 4) Salvation and community (14 min.); 5) The rise and fall of the early Methodist band meeting (15 min.); 6) How to start a band meeting (22 min.); 7) The keys to a thriving band meeting (17 min.); 8) A life-changing experience (13 min.).
