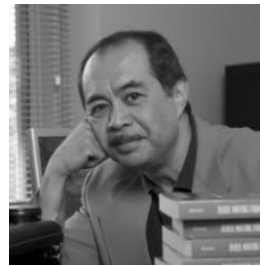

Facilitated by Dr. Richard Guzman, we will take a deep faith-based look at the systems that underlie and support racism.
