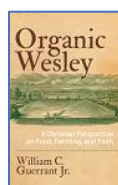
**BREAKING THE CODE: UNDERSTANDING THE BOOK OF REVELATION (102180)** Author: deSilva, David. Revised Edition. This six-session DVD study features David deSilva exploring the main ideas of Bruce Metzger's book 'Breaking the Code,' which has been updated with current biblical research and additional teaching. Sessions: 1) John's vision (10 min.); 2) Letters to churches (10 min.); 3) God, the Lamb, and seven seals (9 min.); 4) The dragon, the beasts, and seven trumpets (8 min.); 5) Babylon and seven bowls (9 min.); 6) New heaven and new earth (9 min.). The DVD also has four short (4-6 min.) segments of archaeological discoveries at the locations mentioned in the book.

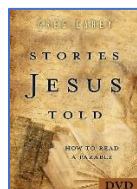

life that have helped him understand what it truly means to love everybody the way Jesus loved them. Sessions: 1) Love people where you are (17 min.); 2) Catch people on the bounce (17 min.); 3) Don't play it safe (19 min.); 4) Look at what's in your bucket (18 min.); 5) Love even the difficult people (18 min.). 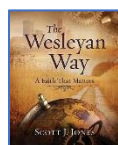
**ORGANIC WESLEY: A CHRISTIAN PERSPECTIVE ON FOOD, FARMING, AND FAITH (115027)** Author: Guerrant, William. In this ten-session DVD study, William Guerrant examines the intersection of the teachings of John Wesley with the ethics of the contemporary food movement. Wesley's teachings can provide us with guidance as we seek to make food choices that are consistent with our Christian values -- the choices that are best for our bodies, our fellow creatures, our communities, and the environment. 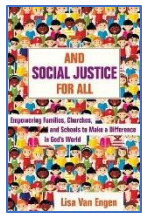

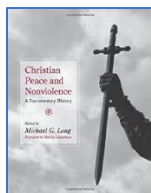

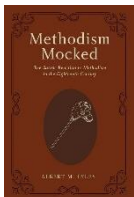

In this resource for parents and teachers, Lisa Van Engen shares basic information on fourteen global issues and provides discussion questions, Bible studies, book and activity suggestions, and 'ways to make a difference' for each topic. **Ideas are provided for the following age groups: ages 3-6, ages 7-11, and ages 12+.** Chapters: Clean water and sanitation - cracked cisterns; Creation care - an open window; Disabilities - a place for everyone; Education - summoning the best of us; Fair trade - giving beyond our means; Families - those we love; Health care - to touch the hem of His robe; Human trafficking - modern-day abolitionists; Hunger - gleaned the edges; Immigrants and refugees - the gift we received; Peace - how we see others; Poverty - having been entrusted much; Race - mend our fractures; Changemakers - fierce light. 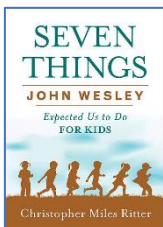

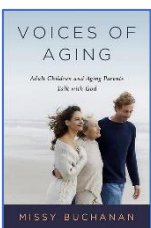

Designed as a discussion starter between adults and their parents, Missy Buchanan provides a variety of meditations, each one including a Bible passage, a short reading each for the parent and child, a short passage on moving forward, and a prayer. Topics: doing the best I can, can't take it with you, the car, wisdom, seasons, memories, doctors and hospitals, parent/child, money, dignity, home, siblings, stress, friends, holidays, boundaries, death, laughter, off-center, change.
