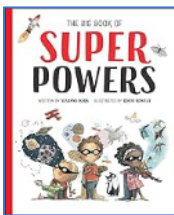

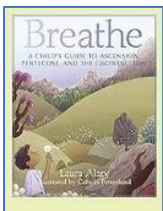

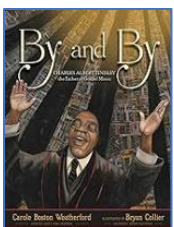

What's your superpower? With eighteen half-page stories of kids with everyday superpowers, this picture book will inspire kids to look inside and find what makes them extraordinary! Moving beyond long ago and far away events, it guides young and old to wonder about and watch for the presence and work of the Spirit here and now, in practices of prayer and mindfulness, through acts of justice, generosity, and kindness, and even in each other. 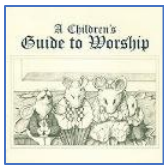

Designed for Minecraft fans, this book includes 60 devotions; each one includes a gameplay secret for Minecraft success, a Bible verse, a question for reflection or discussion, and a short devotional reading. Includes an index of topics and Bible verses. Can be used by parents and teachers as a contemporary way to discuss spiritual topics. Age: upper elementary – middle school. 253 Pages.

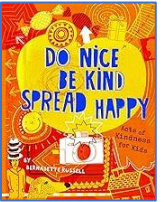


BY AND BY: CHARLES ALBERT TINDLEY, THE FATHER OF GOSPEL MUSIC (821013) Author: Weatherford, Carole Boston. Designed for children ages 4 - 8, this full-color picture book is a biography about gospel composer and preacher Charles Albert Tindley, best known for the gospel hymn "We'll Understand It Better By and By." At a time when most African Americans were still enslaved, Charles Tindley was born free. His childhood was far from easy, with backbreaking hours in the fields, and no opportunity to go to school. But the spirituals he heard as he worked made him long to know how to read the Gospel for himself. Late at night, he taught himself to read from scraps of newspapers. From those small scraps, young Charles raised himself to become a

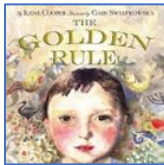
founding father of American gospel music whose hymn was the basis for the Civil Rights anthem “We Shall Overcome.” Told in lilting verse with snippets of spirituals and Tindley’s own hymns woven throughout, author Carole Boston Weatherford’s lyrical words and Bryan Collier’s luminous illustrations celebrate a man whose music and conviction has inspired countless lives. Includes bibliography. Age: preschool – upper elementary. 41 Pages.



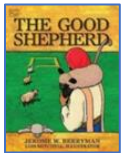

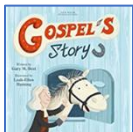

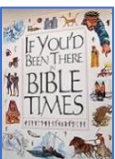

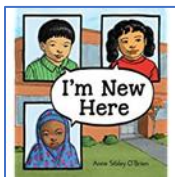

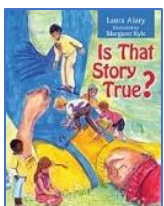

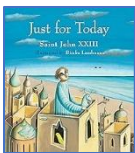

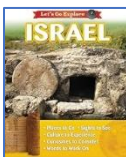

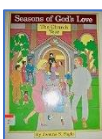
LITTLE MOLE FINDS HOPE (821014) Author: Nellist, Glenys. In this full-color picture book designed for ages 3 – 6, author Glenys Nellist and illustrator Sally Garland tell an endearing story sure to lift the spirits of people emerging from the cold of winter or a challenging season of life and inspire them to look for signs that spring will come again. When Little Mole is feeling sad in his dark, underground home, his mother shows him how to look for hope. He finds that signs of spring are everywhere, from the daffodil bulbs under the soil to the tiny buds on the branches above. Hope can be found--even in the darkest places. Includes discussion questions for children and notes for parents and caregivers. Age: preschool – lower elementary. 28 Pages.



LUIS Y MIA/MIA AND LUIS (818148) Author: Reyna, Monica and Zimmerman, L.J. This paperback book for children is a flip-over book that tells the story of a cross-cultural friendship from each child's perspective. Luis is the child of Mexican immigrants and Mia is a White American child. Their story begins when Mia makes a culturally insensitive remark to Luis. Prayer and thoughtful conversations with family help Luis and Mia move past this rocky start and develop a lasting friendship. Mia's story explores important issues such as what makes someone American, biblical perspectives on immigrants, and how to make amends. Luis's story explores issues such as cultural pride, challenges faced by immigrants, and forgiveness. This book, with both English and Spanish text, will help children ages 6-9 understand the importance of showing love to people who are different, apologizing when you're wrong, forgiving one another, and making everyone feel welcome. Age: elementary. 60 Pages.



MAYBE GOD IS LIKE THAT TOO (817278) Author: Grant, Jennifer. Every child wonders where God lives or what God is like. In this full-color picture book, a young boy asks his grandma where God is in their city. She invites him to pay attention to where he sees the fruit of the Spirit. Where love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are, there too is God. The boy sees God in the kindness of a doorman holding the door for a man using a wheelchair, in the patience of his teacher helping him tie his shoes, and in the love, faithfulness, and gentleness of his grandma. An ordinary day in his city opens this young boy's eyes to God's Spirit at work all around him. Illustrations by Benjamin Schipper. Age: elementary. 29 Pages.



SEASONS OF GOD'S LOVE: THE CHURCH YEAR (826390) Author: Fogle, Jeanne S. This full-color picture book for children explains the special days and seasons in the Christian church year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost. Age: lower elementary. 32 Pages.



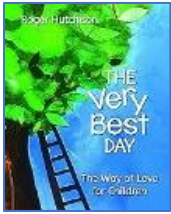

A biography of Kenyan Nobel Peace Prize winner and environmentalist Wangari Maathai, a female scientist who made a stand in the face of opposition to women's rights and started her own Green Belt Movement, an effort to restore Kenya's ecosystem by planting millions of trees. Age: elementary. 39 Pages.



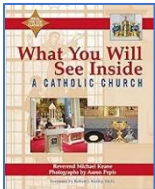

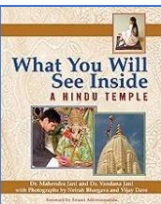

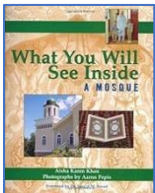

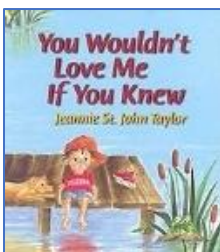

YOU WOULDN'T LOVE ME IF YOU KNEW (819019) Author: Taylor, Jeannie St. John. This story of forgiveness tells of a little boy who does something "bad" for which he thinks he cannot be forgiven. He does a number of "good" things, but every time someone thanks him and says that he is "good," he feels "bad." His mother assures him that she can forgive him and that Jesus will as well. We never know what the "bad" thing actually is as he whispers in his mother's ear, which will allow each child to identify with the situation. Ages 5-8. Includes a note to parents on how to talk to children about this topic. Age: elementary. 29 Pages.
