






ADVENT JESSE TREE (814054) Author: Lambert, Dean Meador. Devotions for Children and Adults to Prepare for the Coming of the Christ Child at Christmas. Designed as a 25-day devotional guide, this book includes a short devotion each day for both children and adults. Suggestions for making an Advent Jesse Tree with ornaments is included. 96 Pages.



ADVENT: THE ONCE AND FUTURE COMING OF JESUS CHRIST (818175) Author: Rutledge, Fleming. A collection of fifty writings and sermons collected from over forty-five years of preaching. Not just about the Christmas season, they also discuss the second coming, the last judgment, the end of the world, and the ethical dimension of the life of waiting and watching while also seeking to live a life of meaningful action. 406 Pages.



BEHOLD! CULTIVATING ATTENTIVENESS IN THE SEASON OF ADVENT (811057) Author: Hawkins, Pamela. Allow the word "Behold!" to draw you into a prayerful Advent, whether individually or with a group. Be attentive to expectancy, preparation, faith, and promise. Then as you draw near to the manger, you will find what you seek and what God chooses to give. This book provides daily meditations as well as a weekly prayer practice such as praying with images, silent prayer, using prayer beads, and compline. A guide for leaders adapts this book for group use. 109 Pages.



BIRTH: THE MYSTERY OF BEING BORN (821055) Author: Howell, James C. This book explores the connections between our own birth, the experience of having children, and the new birth of the Christian life. Seasoned pastor James Howell offers theological perspectives on a variety of themes associated with birth, such as who we are in light of having once lived in utero, why people might have children, infertility, adoption, baptism, and how to make sense of it all in light of God coming to us first in Mary's womb and then as an infant. Chapters: In my mother's womb; My birthday; Unchosenness and being chosen; Mary, mother of our Lord; The birth of Jesus; Jesus's first days; Why have children?; Having children; The first days after birth; Infertility and medicine; When medicine fails; Adoption; Remember your baptism; You must be born again. 

Includes daily readings, a Blue Christmas worship service, and discussion questions for group study. 111 Pages.

Intertwined throughout the story and the guide are the themes of hope, redemption, transformation, the work of the Spirit, and the Christian life. 


CHRIST BESIDE ME, CHRIST WITHIN ME: CELTIC BLESSINGS (817268) Author: Richardson, Beth.







A special volume of Advent and Christmas meditations based on the seasonal hymns of Charles Wesley. Each daily meditation, keyed to the Scripture reading for the day and portions of Wesley's texts, concludes with a brief prayer based on the day's theme. Part 1: Hymns and Prayers for Advent. Part 2: Hymns and Prayers for the Twelve Days of Christmas. Part 3: Formats for Morning and Evening Prayer. Includes Scripture index and hymn tune and meter index. 112 Pages.






CHRISTMAS: THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE UGLY -- AN ADVENT STUDY FOR ADULTS



Each lesson includes a reference to a key passage of Scripture, a brief reflection, questions for reflection or discussion, a suggested Christmas carol, and a brief prayer. Sessions: 1) Let's keep Herod in Christmas; 2) Let's keep the wise men in Christmas; 3) Let's keep Joseph in Christmas; 4) Let's keep the shepherds in Christmas. 47 Pages. KEEP WATCH WITH ME: AN ADVENT READER FOR PEACEMAKERS (819132) Author: Brown, Claire and McRay, Michael, editors. For those who work for social justice, Advent is the season not only for repentance, but for checking in on the needs of the world as well. This book offers stories, reflections, prayers, and spiritual practices to sustain and challenge the faith of those who work for justice and peace. It features daily devotionals for December 1-25 by a distinctively diverse collection of collaborators including writers who are black, white, LGBTQ, Latinx, Palestinian, incarcerated, activists, Native American, and more. 


LET US GO NOW TO BETHLEHEM: DAILY DEVOTIONS FOR ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS (820123) Author: Outcalt, Todd. This book contains two-page devotions for the 28 days of Advent, the 12 days of Christmas, and the day of Epiphany. For small-group leaders, the book includes a **six-week** study guide with weekly questions for reflection and conversation, a suggested scripture passage for each week, and an invitation to ponder the happenings of that week. As the Gospel of Luke attests, Let Us Go Now to Bethlehem is both an expectant declaration filled with mystery and a declaration of faith. Up to 12 copies available.



MAKING ROOM: SHARING THE LOVE OF CHRISTMAS (820121) Author: Robb, Ed. This **four-week** book study explores the warmth of welcome at Christmas following interactions with the Holy Family, the shepherds, and the magi. The story of Christ's birth encourages us to widen our borders and increase our sense of community—and make room for others. TASTE & SEE: EXPERIENCING THE STORIES OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS (817092) Author: Johnson, Jan. In this study with daily readings, Jan Johnson invites you to become part of the events surrounding the birth of the Christ child. She guides readers to live inside the story for a while, exploring it from the perspectives of its central figures. Weekly topics: 1) Experiencing the blessing of Zechariah and Elizabeth; 2) Experiencing Mary's preparation; 3) Experiencing Joseph's challenge; 4) Experiencing the birth of Christ. Includes a post-Advent group session - Experiencing the journey to safety (Mt. 2:13-23). Includes a leader's guide and suggestions for using the material in family settings. Up to 91 copies available.
