**Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza Elected Vice Chair of Key Bay Area Transportation Board**

*Metropolitan Transportation Commission administers \$2 billion annually*

NAPA – At their February regular meeting, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) voted unanimously to elect Napa County Supervisor Alfredo Pedroza as Vice Chair for a two-year term.

“Napa County and the Bay Area continues to face major transportation and housing challenges that require us to think and plan regionally,” Pedroza said. “I am excited to continue to work for Napa County and on behalf of the Bay Area in this new capacity to ensure that we continue to invest in our transportation infrastructure and network.”

MTC is a public, governmental agency responsible for planning, financing and coordinating transportation for the nine-county San Francisco Bay Area. The federal government, state Legislature and Bay Area voters have assigned MTC a wide-ranging portfolio to deliver a smooth-functioning, well-maintained transportation system. One of MTC’s core roles is to adopt a long-range plan to guide transportation and housing in the Bay Area. MTC also works to secure funds to make this regional vision a reality. Twenty-one commissioners representing Bay Area counties and cities govern MTC. The commission meets monthly and acts as the Bay Area Toll Authority and the Service Authority for Freeways and Expressways.
