The Torrance Chamber will host a Torrance Unified School District Candidates Forum on October 8th at 8:30 a.m. The virtual forum will bring together four candidates vying for two seats on the Board of Education. Terry Ragins will be terming off the board in December after 17 years of service. Don Lee will also be terming off the board in December after serving 13 years.

Madison Laster comes with a background of serving as a student board member of the Redondo Beach Unified School District's Board of Education during the 2017 and 2018 school years. Laster graduated in 2018 from Redondo High School as she was receiving her associate degree from El Camino College in Torrance. She finished her four-year degree at Sacramento State in December 2019 with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science. "As a board member, you need to advocate on behalf of students, on behalf of the community, to advocate for funding and for a more inclusive curriculum," stated Laster. She believes that her experience as a member of various education-related boards and organizations has prepared her well for membership on the Torrance school board.
