



Yesterday, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors moved forward with their overreaching motion to create "Public Health Councils" composed of employees at their work sites to monitor compliance.

All five supervisors voted in favor of the motion - which directs the Department of Public Health to create an implementation plan by September 29. The motion also asks the department to incorporate a phased-in approach that prioritizes sectors-based outbreaks and increased stakeholder engagement.
