Jorge Simón dreamed of effecting change on a grand scale, and this guiding philosophy would lead him through a decades-long career in public service.

After graduating from Notre Dame, **Jorge Simón '69** attended the University of Dayton, Ohio for an undergraduate degree in social work. He began

his career by working for the Department of Children and Family Services at Long Lane Reform School in Middletown, first as a cottage father and then as a caseworker. While there, he enrolled in the Master of Social Work program at the University of Connecticut, and would eventually pursue a joint law degree. Upon earning his MSW, Jorge was hired as a social worker for the American School for the Deaf while simultaneously studying for his J.D.

Jorge received his law degree in 1982 and began working as a prosecutor for the Office of the Chief State's Attorney. He later opened a private practice, operating primarily as a defense attorney, and in 1991 was appointed Corporation Council for the City of Hartford. In 1996, our ambitious Lancer took up the gavel as a Superior Court Judge.

His first assignment on the bench was in New Haven, where he was tasked with starting Connecticut's very first drug court. In this capacity, Jorge worked with a designated team to help individuals struggling with addiction in the criminal justice system receive rehabilitation. The New Haven court was very successful, and Jorge's team eventually helped mentor other states. After four years, Jorge left to work in numerous other courts, mostly as a presiding judge over criminal and divorce pre-trial cases.

In 2019, the Honorable Judge Jorge Simón retired after twenty three years on the bench. He now spends much of his time biking, hiking, traveling with his wife and visiting his grandchildren in the Michigan area.


