



2017 USA Men's National Deaf Ice Hockey Team Announced

Chicago, IL – The American Hearing Impaired Hockey Association (AHIHA) has released the 23-man roster that will compete in the 3rd World Deaf Ice Hockey Championships to be held in April of 2017 in Amherst, New York.

The 2017 U.S. National Deaf Ice Hockey team was chosen from players who attended the AHIHA tryout this summer in Buffalo, NY. The team has a geographically diverse roster with players from 13 different states.

Head Coach Joe Gotfryd said “The coaching staff is excited about our team that will represent the USA in the upcoming WDIHC. The team is comprised mainly of veteran players who have played for us in other international events with a few young players being introduced to the international scene for the first time. The team is prepared for the high level of competition that we will face in this tournament and ready for the challenge.”

The World Deaf Ice Hockey Championships will take place in Amherst, New York, April 19th – April 29th, 2017. Team USA won the Bronze medal at the 2015 Deaflympics held in Khanty-Mansiysk, Russia.

The team operates under the guidelines of the USA Deaf Sports Federation. To qualify for the games, athletes must have a hearing loss of at least 55 dB in their "better ear". Hearing aids, cochlear implants and the like are not allowed to be used in competition, to place all athletes on the same level.

Funding for athletes is provided by the American Hearing Impaired Hockey Association through private donations and support from the USA Hockey Foundation. Donations to help cover player expenses can be sent to the address below.
