


LIVING THE LANCER LIFE

Steve Hartford '80 was born to practice law. As the grandson and nephew of two lawyers, Steve had the childhood dream of walking the same path. Little did he know it would take him on a journey to the far reaches of the United States.

Upon graduating from Notre Dame, Steve attended Fairfield University for his bachelor's in political science and history. He then studied at the Thomas Cooley Law School in Lansing, Michigan before starting his career in his family law firm, established in 1934 by his grandfather in Westerly, Rhode Island. After fifteen years with the firm, Steve took on the role of city attorney for Westerly, and later, the executive counsel for the office of the governor of Rhode Island. As a resident of the "Ocean State," Steve eventually became the Rhode Island director of administration under Governor Lincoln Chafee.



Following Chafee's term, Steve was presented with the opportunity of a lifetime: a move to Sitka, Alaska to become the chief operating officer for a local hospital. Steve saw this as an exciting new chapter, and spent the next five years in this role. He then re-entered the field of law as the legal director for the Sitka Tribe of Alaska. Steve is now the general counsel for the Ketchikan Indian Community, which is "a tribal government that represents all of the Alaskan natives and Native Americans living in and around Ketchikan," Steve said. In this capacity, he provides legal direction to KIC and advises on broader scope items regarding the United States government.

A proud Notre Dame alumni, Steve has never forgotten his roots. In fact, the class of 1980 recently held their 40th reunion and Steve made sure to help with alumni outreach leading up to the event. He is also the dear friend of our recent ND hall of fame inductee, Mark Halstead '80, who he met while acting in the spring musical, *My Fair Lady*. "Mark was the set designer for that show, and he and I developed a close bond through the spring musical," Steve said.

Join us in welcoming **Elizabeth Potenziani** to the Lancer family!


