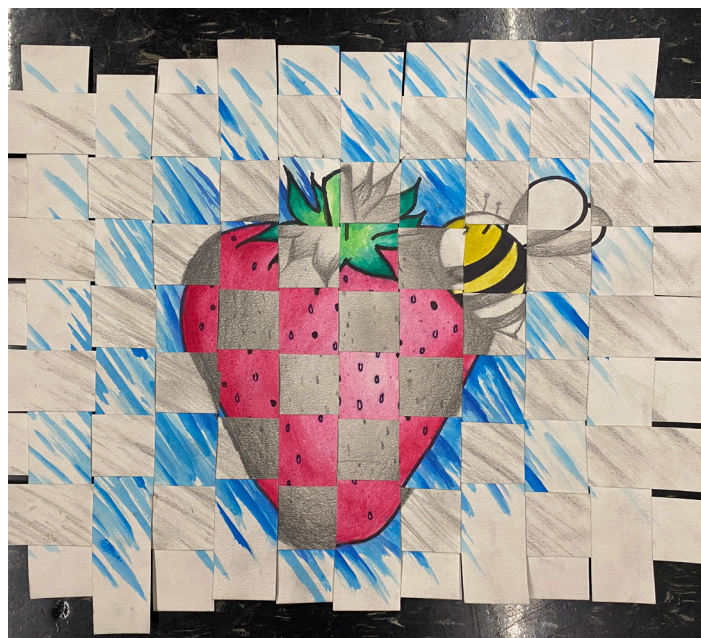
## SPANISH 3 HONORS SERVICE LEARNING

## THEOLOGY

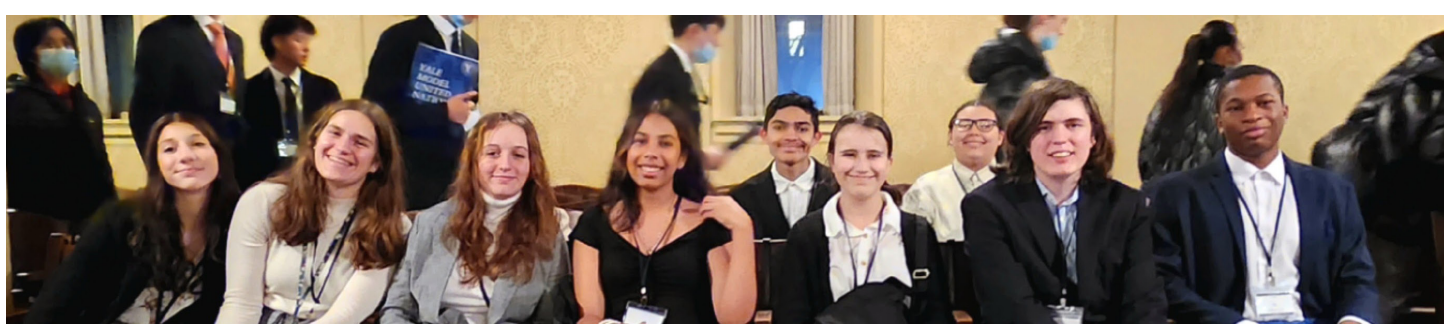
