TINA R. GOLDSTEIN

Tina R. Goldstein, Ph.D., has a passion for improving the outcomes for youth with mood disorders and suicidality. This passion has driven her to become a national expert in the field. She combines research with her direct clinical experience to work toward improving both assessment and treatment for children and adolescents. She is also committed to providing training, supervision and consulting to clinicians and programs throughout the country, and internationally, in order to enhance quality and accessibility of care. Dr. Goldstein's research program is supported by grant funding from federal and private foundations including the National Institute of Mental Health and the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. She is the author of over 80 peer-reviewed manuscripts and book chapters on the topics of suicidality and mood disorders in youth, and is co-author of a book on the treatment of depressed and suicidal youth.



ROSS W. GREENE



Ross W. Greene, Ph.D., is the originator of the innovative, empirically-supported approach now known as *Collaborative & Proactive Solutions* (CPS), as described in his influential books *The Explosive Child*, *Lost at School*, *Lost & Found*, and the recently released *Raising Human Beings*. Dr. Greene was on the faculty at Harvard Medical School for over 20 years, and is now Founding Director of the non-profit Lives in the Balance. Dr. Greene has worked with several thousand behaviorally-challenging kids and their families, and he and his colleagues have overseen implementation and evaluation of the CPS model in a variety of environments, with dramatic effect: significant reductions in discipline referrals, detentions, suspensions, and use of restraint procedures and solitary confinement. He has infused the parenting and teaching of all kids with humanity, empathy, and compassion.
