


Deer Problems?

Why reduce deer numbers locally?

Regulating the local population's size will help to reduce:

- Public safety issues such as deer/vehicle collisions (about 60,000 car collisions in VA are documented each year)
- Tick born illnesses such as Lyme disease, Ehrlichiosis, Rocky Mountain Spotted fever and Babesiosis
- The spread of Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)
- Landscape, garden, and ornamental shrub damage
- Ecosystem and biodiversity damage

Who are we?

- Rangeland is a professional deer management company specializing with archery equipment that will help reduce your deer problems, locally balance the ecosystem, and help feed the hungry.
- Managed by local businessman Tony Shifflett and bringing over 30 years of local deer removal experience-our number one priority is safety.
- Rangeland carries a 2-million-dollar insurance policy on each of its hunters.

Hunter Guidelines:

- Hunters must adhere to strict Rangeland safety guidelines and hunt with only with modern archery equipment.
- Hunters must obey all state and local regulations.
- Hunters are required to participate in VA Hunters for the Hungry program-a charity organization whose mission is to provide donated venison to people in need.

When can Rangeland operate?

- Rangeland prefers to operate from about August 15th to March 15th to coincide with the VA Hunters for the Hungry program.
- Outside the regulated VA archery season landowners may contact the VA Game Commission and apply for permits
- Property owner fees are based on a case-by-case situation.

Hunt Club Rules

1. All hunters must inspect every tree stand before entering stand.
2. All hunters must wear safety harness while hunting on all properties controlled by Rangeland Wildlife Management LLC.
3. No guest will be permitted on properties without written consent
4. No hunter shall consume alcohol or smoke tobacco products while on properties
5. All hunters shall obey all Virginia State laws.
6. All hunters must display the identifying window tag on vehicle. Window tags must be up to date or vehicle is subject to being towed.
- 6.1 Carry proper ID with them at all times, and allow land owners to take a picture of the ID in hand.
7. All hunters will show respect to the land owners and the residents and their guest.
8. All hunters must text or call the president or the assigned hunt master before entering any property.
9. Do not leave trash behind and if you see trash remove it.
10. All hunters must donate at least one deer to Hunters for the hungry
11. No off road motorized vehicles will be allowed
12. All Minors must have an adult on the property while hunting.
13. All hunters must to the best of his/her ability retrieve all arrows and deer. If an arrow is lost or a deer not recovered it must be reported to the hunt master of that property.
14. All club dues must be paid by July 15th or there will be a \$25.00 late fee. If not paid by August 1st you will have to be voted back into the club.
15. When a kill is made, a picture must be text to my cell 434 989 4477 with the hunter's name and tag number. This is to get a more accurate count on the deer taken.
16. All tree stands must be at least 18 feet high and shots are limited to 25 yards or less. (this is to prevent the arrow from going astray.)
