




Quarter Square Triangles



Quarter Square Triangle Squares are patchwork units made from four equal 90° triangles.

The straight grain of the fabric is on the long side of the triangle to avoid stretching of the Triangle Square and completed quilt block.


Step 1: Use your favorite method and make Half Square Triangle Squares.




Step 2: Place 2 Half Square Triangle Squares right sides together.

Alternate the seam allowances and the fabrics.


Use the Creative Grids Seam Guide Tool to mark the diagonal.



Step 3: Stitch the diagonals.




Step 4: Cut on the diagonal line between the stitching and press to make 2 Quarter Square Triangle Squares.




Quarter Square Triangle Variations

Change the appearance of Quarter Square Triangle Squares by sewing them with a variety of combinations of Half Square Triangle Squares or plain squares.

When Quarter Square Triangle Squares are made from identical Half Square Triangle Squares, the resulting Quarter Square Triangle Squares are identical and symmetrical.



When Quarter Square Triangle Squares are made from 2 different Half Square Triangle Squares, the resulting Quarter Square Triangle Squares are mirror images of each other.



When Triangle Squares are made from a Half Square Triangle Square and a Plain Square, the resulting Triangle Squares contain 2 Quarter Square Triangles and 1 Half Square Triangle and are mirror images of each other.
