Troublesome Behaviors:

The clients we think of as “difficult” or “problematic” or “puzzling” are most often people who fit a relatively new category of diagnosis called “Personality Disorder.” Significantly distinct from “psychiatric disorders,” the major feature of Personality Disordered individuals is that they behave inappropriately and cause conflicts, upsets, and distress in those around them. Fortunately, over 50 years of intensive research has discovered the inner workings of Personality Disorders, and effective methods have been developed for both treating and managing people who show the condition.
