
Our prospective knitter left the store beaming - with her 'great find' and anticipating her new found knitting hobby.



FINANCIAL SUMMARY

2016 confirmed the growing popularity and need for a source of excellent quality clothing and small housewares in the Lake Shore Mimico area. Sales have increased significantly since we first opened on December 1, 2014, as word spread about the new store that offered great finds and always a warm and welcoming volunteer staff. Jeannie Martinez, our Great Finds Manager, has worked closely with our approximately thirty dedicated volunteers to establish an attractive and friendly place to visit. We have seen a dramatic increase in the number of customers and in the frequency of their visits, resulting in sales increases in the range of 30% year over year.

Great Finds is our most visible ministry, serving many families who struggle to make ends meet and to provide for their families. Not as visible are the many relationships and opportunities for our volunteers and staff to offer their assistance or maybe just to demonstrate a genuine concern, a listening ear or an offer to remember them in prayer. We also provide necessities at no cost to those who cannot afford even the minimal prices through our benevolent program.






