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FIRE PREVENTION TIPS

- 1) **Keeping Your Workplace Clean:** this is especially important right now. Not only do you want to prevent obstructions in case of a fire, but you also want to sanitize your workstations constantly. Remember to remove trash or anything that could cause a fire before leaving for the day. Make sure all exits are clear.
- 2) **Store Hazardous Chemicals Properly:** Always make sure that all hazardous chemicals are placed in a safe storage. Read the instructions and precautions on proper handling and storing of each chemical you have in your workplace. Label each container correctly.
- 3) **Maintain Electrical Equipment:** Keep up with your maintenance and testing to ensure all equipment is functioning properly
- 4) **Clear Markings:** Make sure all your exits, fire extinguishers, smoking areas, and fire alarms are clearly marked.
- 5) **Power Strips:** Don't overload circuits and make sure you are using the correct power strips for your occupancy.
- 6) **Emergency Plan:** Especially right now, make sure you are committed to keeping your emergency plan up to date. Along with any emergency numbers.
- 7) **Smoke Alarms:** Check all smoke alarms, make sure they are properly installed and clean of debris.
- 8) **Educate:** Keep your employees and / or residents educated on any fire safety tips, plans, or changes. Keep everyone on the same page.
- 9) **Know:** Remember that we are here to help you. Should you have questions arise, please reach out to us.
- 10) **Keep Updated:** Check emails often. Our office sends out very important information. Listen to only accredited websites regarding any information.
