



February 2024 Reflections

Some good news for Kansas facilities...skilled, LTC, AL, Residential Healthcare, Home Plus: near the beginning of the pandemic, Kansas, at the urging of the Advocates, created a visitation assessment that was to be completed for each resident related to visitation preferences. That document has remained in effect, at least facilities were never notified that the documented assessments were not required until this past week, when, upon request from KHCA staff, Lacey Hunter confirmed that those visitation preference assessments were no longer necessary.

Did you know that F884 is the most frequently cited regulation in CMS FY2024 (since October 2023)? It has been cited 515 times IN KANSAS since October 1st and resulted in a deficiency 441.5% of the time, resulting in \$776,272.50 in civil money penalties SINCE OCTOBER. AHCA has developed the NHSN Tip Sheet <https://www.ahcancal.org/Survey-Regulatory-Legal/MemberOnlyDocs/NHSN%20Tip%20Sheet.pdf>. The form will be available to you on the CPO website. You have to log into the AHCA website to access it but it covers:

- Ensure more than one person has access to NHSN to complete mandatory reporting and is trained in data collection and reporting.
- Avoid waiting until Saturday or Sunday to report.
- If an outage occurs in the system when trying to submit data, keep a record/ document the outage and submit a ticket to nhsn@cdc.gov.
- Review each pathway for complete data before submitting.
- Take and save a screen shot from the NHSN Data Entry Screen for each Surveillance Reporting Pathway, COVID-19 Vaccination Module and HCP influenza summary data.
- Enforcement letters are routinely sent via email and placed in CASPER Facility folders.
- Develop a QAPI plan if gaps in the reporting process are identified or noncompliance occurs.
- Check the NHSN CDC LTC COVID-19 Module page routinely for updates.

[McKnight's Senior Living](#) (2/7, Bonvissuto) reports, "Senior living operators who provide, or are considering providing, respite services for family caregivers of people living with dementia can apply for a piece of \$20 million in grant funding." The article adds, "The Alzheimer's Association will use a \$25 million, five-year grant award from the US Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Community Living to establish a new Center for Dementia Respite Innovation tasked with making respite services and service providers more dementia-capable." Of these "funds, up to \$20 million will go to respite providers, with the remaining \$5 million being used to administer the program."

I hope most, if not all, have signed up for the Center of Excellence for Behavioral Health in Nursing Facilities website. The February newsletter arrived and there are some excellent educational presentations and they even offer NAB hours FOR FREE to nursing home administrators. You can't beat that deal. <https://nursinghomebehavioralhealth.org/news-events/>. There are also past virtual trainings available. As you know, training for your staff on behavioral health is now mandated by CMS, so this is an excellent opportunity for you to get your staff educated.

OSHA made changes to the civil penalty amounts based on cost-of-living adjustments for 2024 which went into effect on January 16, 2024. Per McKnights Business Daily News, “OSHA’s maximum penalties for “serious and other-than-serious violations” [will increase](#) from \$15,625 per violation to \$16,131 per violation. The maximum penalty for “willful or repeated violations” will increase from \$156,259 per violation to \$161,323 per violation.”

As was discussed in December, CMS is making good on their promise to review and revise the survey process. Although there were no details released, there is some reason for optimism that the new process would improve consistency in surveys and focus more on facilities that is determined to have “risk of resident harm”. The new process is also hoped to reduce the survey backlog.

Skilled Nursing News (https://skillednursingnews.com/2024/01/cms-focuses-on-resident-mood-interviews-in-newly-issued-nursing-home-mds-draft/?euid=c4b45ae7ce&utm_source=snn-newsletter&utm_medium=email&utm_campaign=3aee191c40&mc_cid=3aee191c40&mc_eid=c4b45ae7ce) reported on January 16th that CMS has issued its draft the new MDS that will be implemented on October 1, 2024. “Changes, effective Oct. 1, [include](#) an update to the list of state RAI coordinators, MDS automation coordinators, CMS locations and contacts, the agency said in a memo. Revisions were also made to provide clarity and additional guidance for Section D and Chapter 6 – dealing with resident mood interviews.

Specifically, additional guidance was added around the question, “Should Resident Mood Interview be Conducted?” which serves as a gateway item for the resident mood interview, or PHQ-2 to 9 and D0500, or staff assessment of resident mood.”

SNF Provider Preview Reports – Now Available

REMINDER: The Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Provider Preview Reports have been updated and are now available. These reports contain provider performance scores for quality measures, which will be published on [Care Compare](#) and [Provider Data Catalog \(PDC\)](#) during the **April 2024** refresh.

The data contained within the Preview Reports are based on quality assessment data submitted by SNFs from **Quarter 3, 2022 through Quarter 2, 2023**. Additionally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) measures reflect data from **Quarter 4, 2022 through Quarter 1, 2023** for the Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel measure, and **Quarter 2, 2023** for the COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage among Healthcare Personnel (HCP) measure. The data for the claims-based measures will display data from **Quarter 4, 2020 through Quarter 3, 2022** for this refresh, and for the SNF Healthcare-Associated Infections (HAI) measure, from **Quarter 4, 2021 through Quarter 3, 2022**.

In January, HHS Office for Civil Rights Released Visitation Guidance Resources. Facilities are required to follow CMS Appendix PP including:

1. The facility must provide immediate access to a resident by immediate family and other relatives of the resident, subject to the resident’s right to deny or withdraw consent at any time;
2. The facility must provide immediate access to a resident by others, subject to reasonable clinical and safety restrictions;

3. The facility must provide reasonable access to a resident by any entity that provides health, social, legal, or other services to the resident; and
4. The facility must have written policies and procedures regarding the visitation rights of residents.

SUMMARY REPORT PUBLISHED: SNF QRP Listening Session: Possible Expansion of MDS Data Submission to All SNF Patients Regardless of Payer

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has published a summary report covering the public, virtual listening session that was held on August 29, 2023. The purpose of the listening session was to seek feedback from administration and management staff, software vendors, and clinical staff on the possible expansion of collection and submission of Minimum Data Set (MDS) assessment data used for the Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Quality Reporting Program (QRP) to include all residents receiving short-term skilled care in a SNF regardless of their payer. The summary report provides an overview of the presentation, stakeholder input on each of the discussion questions, and the key findings.
