

Michele Anderson is an adjunct associate professor at Southwestern School of Law and a retired career prosecutor, with the Los Angeles City Attorney's Office for over 35 years of distinguished service. Fifteen of those years, Ms. Anderson as a special prosecutor, managing complex cases including mortgage fraud, hate crimes, domestic violence, child pornography, abuse, and manslaughter cases. She was also certified as a Drug Recognition Expert, and instructor, and served as a temporary judge.

Ms. Anderson actively participates and serves on the boards of bars and other professional organizations, including the Los Angeles County Bar Association's Board of Trustees. She was the former Chair of LACBA's Criminal Justice Section. She has also served on the boards of the John M. She frequently organizes educational events on voting rights and civil liberties, focusing on advocacy for underserved communities. Ms. Anderson holds a Juris Doctor from Southwestern Law School and is married with two daughters.
