Biscochito offers a Total Life(SM) approach to aging in place that includes customized outings and activities according to plan, such as attending a grandchild's soccer game, hosting a dinner party, or going to museums and cultural events. It also involves support for daily living—things like personal care and hygiene assistance, cooking and meal preparation, transportation to events and appointments, light housekeeping and laundry, shopping and errands, medication reminders, and health monitoring. Applications are open for the Biscochito Fellowship Program at the UNM Anderson School of Management. The Biscochito Fellowship Program is a part-time, fully-funded leadership and entrepreneurial development program running for the duration of the year (spring and fall semesters). Over the course of the program, fellows will work with the Biscochito management team to learn every aspect of starting a new business from human resources, budgeting, program implementation, data collection, scaling nationally, agency development, etc. Participants will work mostly work remotely in Albuquerque; however, some travel to Santa Fe will be required. While remote, participants will interact and engage with the Biscochito management team via Zoom.

Biscochito Fellowship Program covers the following costs:

- A monthly stipend based on 20 hours per week
- In-state tuition for the spring and fall semesters at the University of New Mexico
- Mileage expense for travel to Santa Fe, NM as needed (no less than 2 twice a month)

The Biscochito Fellowship Program at UNM Anderson seeks passionate self-starters from the Anderson School of Management who meet the following criteria:

- Enrolled full-time in an undergraduate or graduate program at the UNM Anderson School of Management
- Committed to working 20 hours per week
- Exhibit cultural awareness and self-regulation
- Have strong data science and data gathering skills
- Bilingual in English/Spanish is a plus (but not required)
- Have a commitment to transform the way the caregiving industry does business locally and nationally with an emphasis on social justice, well-being of workers, leadership shifts, and thrive to be the national standard of care.
