1. Michael is a disabled Marine veteran awaiting disability approval, so no income other than SNAP. He lives in great pain due to a severe back injury but is extremely nice and polite. After two years of life in the neighborhood, Julia, Emily, and Dawnielle decided to respond to neighbors' concerns about their kids' academic progress by opening a reading club in their own apartment. This seedling form of Kids Club grew for two more years before the three ladies established Casa Chirilagua as an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit. Now, Casa Chirilagua is a community of parent committee officers, staff members, board members, church partners, children and their families, and many weekly volunteers working together to see the Kingdom of God established in the neighborhood surrounding that little apartment." https://casachirilagua.org/home/
