**The Business Strategy Framework**, facilitated by Dr. Leddick and delivered and developed by Dr. Simester, attracts top educational service agencies (ESAs) from across the country. Those leaders learn and refine their ability to manage entrepreneurial business models within the not-for-profit environment.

Dr. Wade stated, “AESA has endorsed this program for years. We recommended it to our members because we could see the financial impact it has made on ESAs from across the country.”

There is strong evidence that ESAs implementing the Business Strategy framework has made a significant impact on their bottom lines. One AESA member reported program growth went from \$50,000 to nearly \$2 million annually in one program area. Another ESA went from \$28 Million to over \$40 Million in overall revenue growth in five years across all entrepreneurial activities. A third AESA member reported an increase in the competence of program staff to make investments and other business decisions at lower levels of the organization.

“This is an ideal transition. Susan has done a wonderful job of developing and nurturing the growth of the program, and I am confident it will continue to prosper under AESA’s stewardship. We are in the

business of transformation, and I personally am delighted with the outcomes we have achieved over the last few years. I look forward to continuing the partnership in years to come,” said Dr. Simester.

***The Artificial Intelligence Workshop*** is newly developed. Its purpose is to engage in a national dialogue about the role of AI as a market force affecting ESAs now and in the future. - What four things are required to implement AI?
- Can AI help ESAs disrupt, or will it disrupt ESAs?
- What will be the first applications of AI for ESAs?
