A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark.

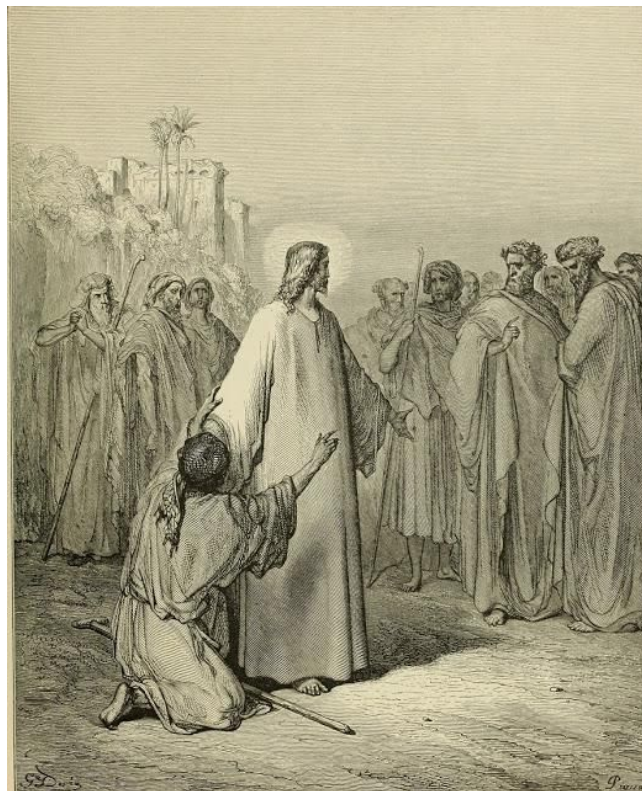
Glory to you, O Lord.
