

Mission Statement

Dear Friends,

We continue to celebrate the Easter Season. The Easter Season is fifty days, not forty days, like Lent, or four weeks or slightly less, like Advent. The Easter Season extends from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. It is sometimes known as the "Festival of Weeks," seven weeks of seven days (49 days), plus one, the fiftieth day, Pentecost.



The foremost symbol of Easter is the Christ Candle, also known as the Easter Candle or the Paschal Candle. It repre-

sents the Risen Christ who is the Light of the World (Jn 8:12; see also 1:4-5,9 and 12:46). The candle is given a prominent location during the Easter Season, usually in the sanctuary or somewhere in the front of the church, and after Pentecost it is moved back to its usual place.

Bill Ritter, a great Christian preacher writes, "Resurrection means the worst thing that happens is not necessarily the last thing that happens. The resurrection is God's 'yes' to life and God's 'yes' to us." "But the ultimate argument for resurrection," says Ritter, "always consists in the change the resurrection produces in the lives of those who believe it."

On Monday after Easter, the world will still be pretty much the way it was on Friday—the homeless will still be homeless, mean-spirited and fear-mongering political rhetoric will still fill the air waves and war will still ravage our world. But because of Easter, on Monday the people who believe in resurrection will go back to work to change all that. Would you go out there to change the world?

On Easter Sunday we came together to witness to the hope of new life coming out of death. On Easter Sunday, we came together to say, "Yes, death still stalks us and darkness still surrounds us, but we have found hope in the one who has been through it all and has come back to give new life. Easter has changed us, now we will go about the business of changing the world."


In all honesty, I can't vouch for it. Human as we are, change and transformation is hard, unless one is intentionally committed to it. But we must commit to it. We are an Easter people. Alleluia is our song.



What does "Home" mean to you? Unhoused clients defined home as "safety, healing, and sanctuary." Losing one's home often means isolation and a loss of community.

Hope Solutions, formerly known as Contra Costa Interfaith Housing, is a leading homeless services provider that provides permanent housing to over 750 households and provides professional supportive services to over 3000 clients annually in Contra Costa County. Hope Solutions has become a proven partner that seeks to end homelessness in our area. 98% of their residents remain housed, 75% maintain or grow their income, and 100% of children in their enrichment move to the next grade level.

Over the past two years, Hope Solutions in partnership with faith communities, cities, the county and housing development partners has embarked on a new and innovative solution to help address our homelessness: Cottage Communities on Faith Owned Land.

Faith partners all around the county are supporting Hope Solutions with land, volunteerism, advocacy and philanthropy. While Christ the King is not planning to build affordable housing on their land, there are hundreds of other faith institutions that are preparing to do so, and we are already working with several to create cottage communities for the unhoused.

CTK-St. Stephen parish can, however, make a meaningful impact through donations to the building and support of these cottage communities. Please support Hope Solutions in their goal to raise a final \$1M to close their \$7M Capital Campaign to provide unhoused individuals and families with hope, new possibilities, and new beginnings by creating new permanent affordable housing with critical supportive services.


