
On a completely different topic, I want to call your attention to a bill that is being proposed in our state legislature. As Catholic Christians, we are called to participate in government and to advocate for the most vulnerable among us.

In 2015, California legalized assisted suicide for adults with illnesses of 6 months or less to live. I'm mystified that proponents of these bills think they can truly predict how long a person will live. That aside, now, a Senator is pushing a bill, SB 1196, to allow all chronically ill Californians to receive assisted suicide, as well as people with dementia. Right now, millions of Californians don't have health care and can't find doctors or hospitals. The State needs to ensure people have good and accessible healthcare so that people with chronic illnesses don't feel coerced into dying prematurely. No one should feel compelled to use assisted suicide due to a scarcity of housing, food, pain management, mental health treatment, home health, or psycho-social support.

The most effective way to fight this bill is by calling your State Senator. Senator Bill Dodd represents District 3, that includes Pleasant Hill and Martinez. His Capitol Office phone number is (916) 651-4003, and his Napa Office phone is (707) 224-1990. Senator Steven Glazer represents District 7, that includes Antioch, Concord, Lafayette and Walnut Creek. His Capitol Office phone number is (916) 651-4007, and his Orinda Office phone number is (925) 258-1176. Your Senator must hear from you. Please call them and tell them that this law goes too far and has the potential to harm you, your loved ones, and especially those with vulnerabilities like dementia.

Have a blessed week remembering and celebrating that we are an Easter people, and "Alleluia" is our song!

Hope Solutions has become a proven partner that seeks to end homelessness in our area. 98% of their residents remain housed, 75% maintain or grow their income, and 100% of children in their enrichment move to the next grade level.

Over the past two years, Hope Solutions in partnership with faith communities, cities, the county and housing development partners has embarked on a new and innovative solution to help address our homelessness: Cottage Communities on Faith Owned Land.

Faith partners all around the county are supporting Hope Solutions with land, volunteerism, advocacy and philanthropy.
