“TO HEAR THE GOSPEL AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE.”

Dear Parishioners:



My favorite Advent tradition from childhood was opening the door each day on the advent calendar that my mother would get for our family. Each day, when it was my turn, I would find a small treat behind the door for that day and got excited about what surprise would be revealed next.

I realized as I grew that the advent calendar was more than just a fun way to countdown to Christmas. It was a way for me to experience the anticipation and longing for Christmas day. While in my mind it was all about Santa Claus and the gifts I would get, my mom made sure I understood that this was about getting ready to celebrate the birth of Christ.

Eventually I connected with the message that Advent is a time of spiritual preparation, anticipation and reflection. It reminds us of the joyful longing of God's people awaiting the coming of the Messiah. My mother died earlier this year at the age of 96 and as I reflect on Advent, I wish that I had told her how much those Advent calendars meant to me.

As we move into the Advent season and the end of the year, we are thankful for all the good God has brought to our parish and for your continuing generosity in donating your time, talents and treasures. Your donations to St. Vincent de Paul continue to make a difference in the lives of those in our community who are most in need of our help.

From a financial standpoint Christ the King and St. Stephen parishes continue to do well. Income from plate collections is steady and we have kept expenses under tight control. Assuming that Christmas donations are consistent with past years, we anticipate ending 2022 with a budget surplus. Christmas collections are usually about 20 percent of our annual total, and we count on your generosity with Christmas donations to make our budget each year.

We have started to prepare our 2023 budget and, as usual, we are challenged to create a realistic balanced budget. This has been getting harder due to increasing expenses while income remains flat. All expenses are seeing increases including, our largest expense, staff salaries.

We are grateful to our parish staff who work very hard to keep things running smoothly. To make sure they are not losing ground to inflation the Diocese of Oakland has authorized a 6 percent cost of living adjustment to salaries for 2023.

What worries me is that our regular plate collections have remained flat for the last several years. With flat income and inflating expenses we face significant pressure on our ability to cover our costs. We will, of course, make the adjustments needed to stay within our income but it is harder than usual this year.

Please Consider Increasing Your Regular Donation

We know that inflation is impacting you as well. If you have been donating the same amount and have not revisited your contribution in a while, I am praying that you will look at your budget and, if you can, find a way to increase your regular donation. Any increase would be a big help to our parishes. Of course we recognize the financial pressure many of you are under and know that this may not be possible.

Fortunately, with the completion of our paving project, we are done with all the major capital investments that we identified in our long-range plan 10 years ago. It will be a few years before we need to make any major capital investments.

Donating to CTK and St. Stephen is easy. We provide a way to give online through our Realm system which is a secure and convenient way to donate. Many parishioners have also set up automated donations through their banks. As always, the basket will continue to be passed around on Sundays. Your generosity in giving to our church is most appreciated.

As we get close to the end of the year, we also remind you that we have services to handle securities (e.g. stocks, bonds) and vehicle donations. And if you are over 72 and need to process an IRS required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA, we are grateful to help.

Realm System

In January we successfully upgraded our system for managing parish records to Realm. So far around 700 of our parishioners have created accounts and are able to view and update their records directly. The system also allows you to see and print your donation record even if you donate by check or give cash via an envelope. We also update Realm weekly with your giving record from our old Vanco system, so you only need to go to Realm to see all your contributions.

If you do not yet have a Realm account, go to this link <https://onrealm.org/ctkph> to request an account.

The Realm online giving option is integrated and easier to use than our old Vanco system. At some point we will phase out the older Vanco system and ask that, if you haven't already, please take some time now to shift your online giving to Realm. Call our parish office if you want some help in setting up online giving or making the transition to Realm.

If you have any questions or concerns, you can also reach out to any of our Finance Council members.

On behalf of your Finance Council, we wish you and your family a meaningful Advent season that provides the spiritual preparation you desire as we celebrate the birth of our savior Jesus.

We are truly thankful for your support and generosity during this past year!

The second candle, also purple, represents faith. It is called the "Bethlehem Candle" as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

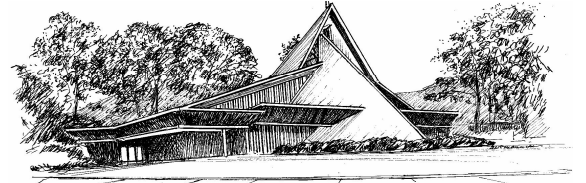

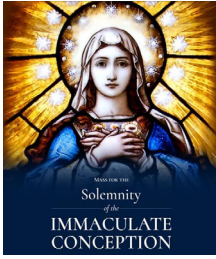
December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Besides our 8:00 am morning Mass, we will have Mass at 6:00 pm.

Bringing up Bread and Wine during Mass:

As you enter the church you will see we now have a binder which is labeled BOOK OF INTENTIONS: for the living and deceased. We invite you to write in it the names of your loved ones or your special intentions.

Also beginning on the First Sunday of Advent we returned to the tradition of bringing bread and wine to the altar. There is a FISH on the table - next to the bread and wine. If you and your spouse/family wish to bring up the offertory gifts – just take the fish with you to your seat. Then the ushers know a family is assigned. When the ushers begin to take up the collection, you can go and stand at the table and be ready to bring up the gifts when the priest stands at the top of the steps. Leave the fish on the table and bring up the BREAD, WINE and the BINDER.

The offering of bread and wine by the priest reminds us to place our own hearts on the altar to be transformed. While this action may seem to be an intermission, it is a liturgical action with a long history and deep symbolism. Saint Augustine called this an “admirable exchange” – for the gifts we offer to God, God gives back to us: Jesus! Saint Augustine said: “Lord, receive our gifts in this wonderful exchange: from all you have given us, we bring you these gifts, and in return, you give us yourself.”

MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

Before the pandemic we had a wonderful group of ministers who reached out weekly to homebound Catholics and those in care facilities. With the pandemic, this could not continue for obvious reasons.

Communion in Care Facilities

Currently, CTK is getting a number of requests for ministers to tend to care facilities. What has been working well is that the Catholic residents are brought together in one room on a Sunday morning. There they watch the Mass being live streamed. Our ministers would simply be present for the online Mass and at Communion time - they would distribute the Eucharist.

Communion to the Homebound

Frequently we receive requests that Communion be brought to people who are homebound and cannot come to church. This would entail setting up a day and time that works for the person as well as for our CTK minister. It could be a weekly visit or whatever the two parties arrange. Basically, it is a short visit and a time of prayer and reception of Communion.

John the Baptist appeared,
preaching in the desert of Judea and saying,
“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!”

MATTHEW 3:1

NEW LIFE

In our scripture translations, word choices matter. When today's first reading tells us that a “stump” will bring forth a new shoot, it's Isaiah's way of telling us that God's miraculous power is at work. Seeds bring forth shoots. Even buried roots can bring forth shoots. But a stump? When we look at a stump, essentially we are seeing the corpse of what used to be a tree. Mortal eyes look and see death, but divine eyes look and see new life. And what a life the Spirit of God will bring forth from this stump! A life filled with wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, and fear of the Lord—the life that we name “Jesus.” How fitting it is that we will also look upon the wood Calvary's cross—a tree of death—and behold that the Spirit of God has turned that tree into a Tree of Life!

NAME CALLING

We often change our tone of voice and vocabulary when we really want to get somebody's attention. Parents will add a middle name to indicate a child is in trouble (a middle and last name when the child is really in trouble). Change of tone and words invites attention, demanding a response. Today John the Baptist does a bit of name-calling: “You brood of vipers!” Even for someone like John, who regularly used potent vocabulary, this way of addressing the holy men—the Pharisees and Sadducees—this level of name-calling stands out. Snakes were commonly understood as a representation of evil, and a poisonous snake in the ancient world held the power of life and death, as the holy men thought they did. Instead of thinking about their own power, John tells them to produce good fruit. We still get ourselves in trouble today when we think that we truly hold any type of power over others, when it's a power that belongs only to God.

EMBRACING CHANGE

Words like John's might cause fear in us, or may hold us back, hesitant. Words like these can also invite us to change our lives. When we do so, we open ourselves to a core virtue of the Advent season: hope. Changing our lives can also open us up to a more vigorous presence of the gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, and fear of the Lord—named in Isaiah today. Recall that it was in that very Spirit we were named for Christ at Baptism. Open your ears and heart to the voice of God, who knows the name given to you on that day. Respond not out of fear, but in love, to the ways that God is calling to you today; calling you to change what needs to be changed, and to welcome Christ today, as you will once again on Christmas day.
