catholic and apostolic Church.

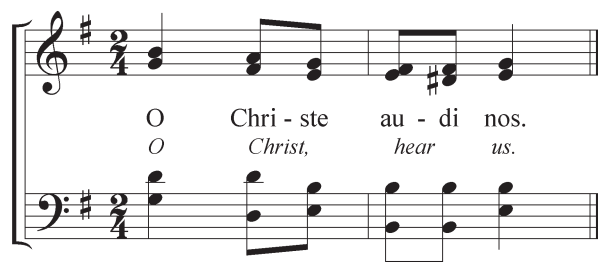
I confess one Baptism

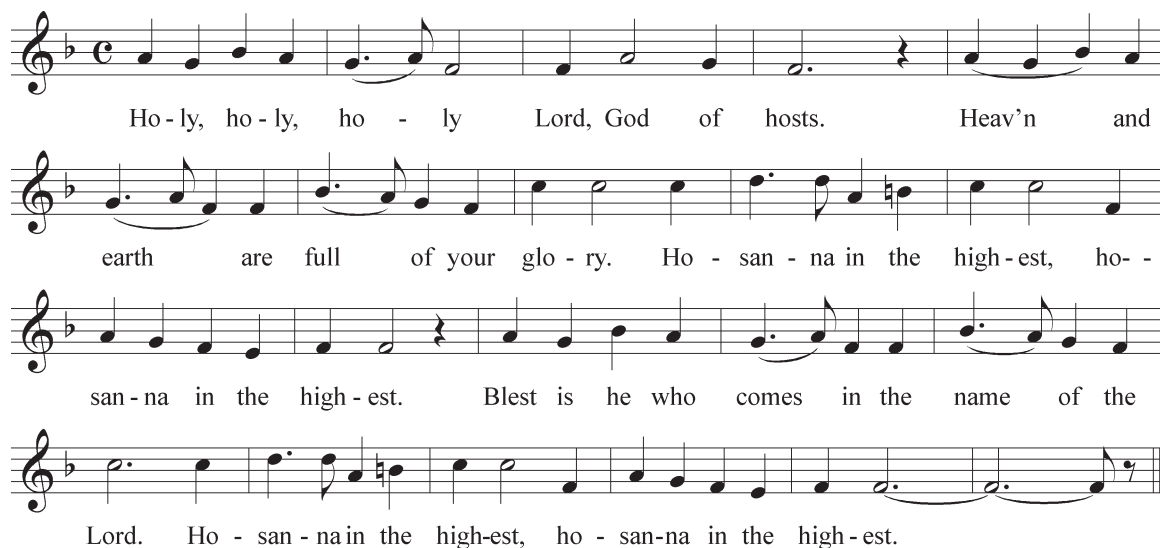

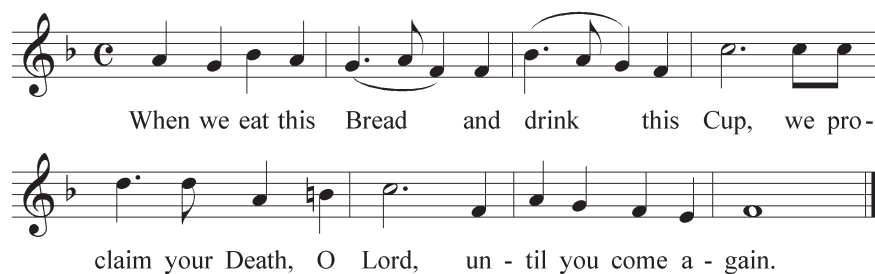
