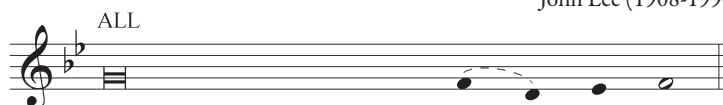

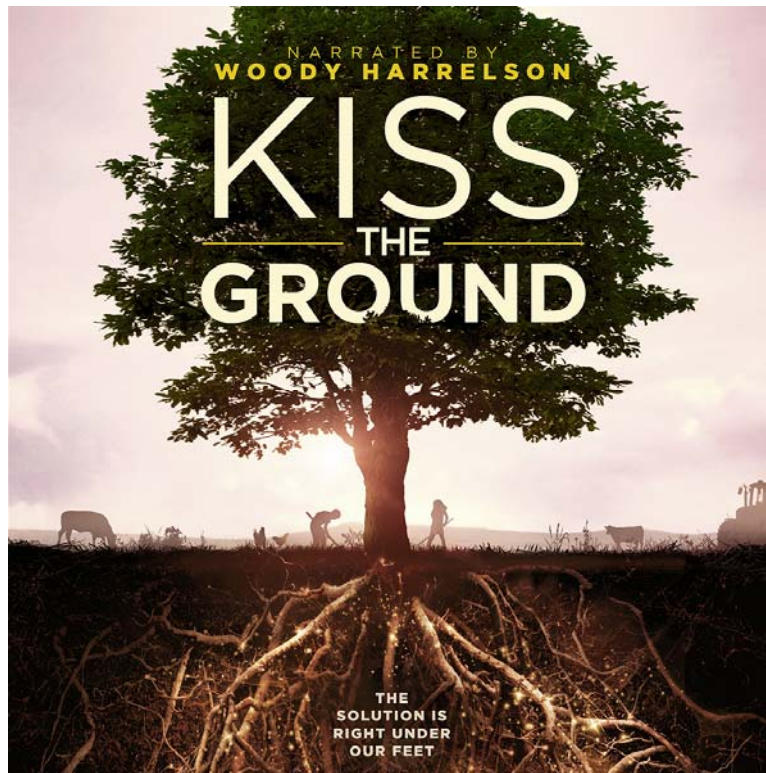

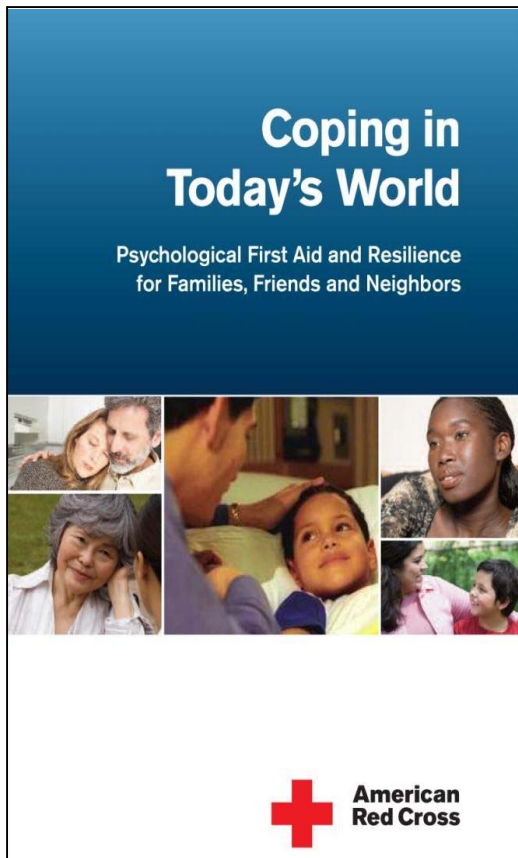

The Hope of the Season is All Around Us!

A reflection from Joyce Mork O'Brien, a long-time volunteer

I have been a citizenship tutor with the Immigrant Assistance ministry for over 20 years. It's been over a year since we all went "virtual" and I have been amazed at how readily this program has adjusted to the unusual circumstances of the pandemic. When all meetings in person were cancelled I was sure the program would shut down. Almost overnight, however, we all learned to "zoom" and for the past year, my two wonderful students from Central America and I meet twice a week via computer. And while it will never be the same as face-to-face, we've adapted, as has the entire program. New volunteers are being recruited and trained, board meetings are held each month, action items for those committed to working with immigrants and refugees are regularly circulated, applications for citizenship are filed, and new citizens sworn in. I am amazed how the entire Cathedral has stepped up in so many ways...people have made masks, food for the homeless is collected, the Family Kitchen serves meals, Mass is held both virtually and in person, and so much more. It is a testament to our incredible community that we have continued to find ways to worship and serve. Easter this year has brought promise of better days when we can all meet again in person. But this past year has shown me the power of resilience and how determination can lead to astounding creativity – a lesson I hope to always remember.
