

A Novena of Mercy for Fair and Just Housing in Seattle and King County

The newly-combined Housing Advocacy Committee of St. James Cathedral and St. Joseph Parish invites you to pray a 9-day novena, in communion with the saints and holy men and women of the Catholic Church, for our unhoused sisters and brothers, and to learn about the issues contributing to the housing crisis.

July 25, 6:30pm: *Opening Novena Prayer at St. Joseph Church*

July 26-August 1: *Days of Novena Prayer*

Every morning of the novena, the daily prayers will be emailed to participants, who can then pray the novena at any time suitable for their schedules.

August 2, 6:30pm: *Contemplative Prayer with music from Taizé at St. James Cathedral.* On the first Friday of August, novena participants are invited to gather together to conclude the novena for fair and just housing in our region.
