



CARE FOR CREATION ADVOCACY OF THE WEEK In a historic step toward salmon recovery, Senator Patty Murray and Governor Jay Inslee have released a draft Lower Snake River Dams Replacement Report that is open for public comment until July 11. The study analyzes replacing the services currently provided by the four Lower Snake River dams and finds that the dams' services – energy, irrigation, and barge transportation – can be fully, feasibly, and affordably replaced with reliable, cost-effective alternatives. Most importantly, the report addresses how the loss of salmon is a historic and ongoing injustice to Northwest Tribes who were promised the right to fish forever.
