DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET (10:30am)

Cathedral youth readers will lead the Divine Mercy Chaplet, which uses regular rosary beads.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Introduction (three times):

*O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus
as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!*

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

On the ten small beads of each decade:

*For the sake of His sorrowful Passion,
have mercy on us and on the whole world.*

Conclusion (three times):

*Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One,
have mercy on us and on the whole world.*

Closing Prayer:

*Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible,
look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us,
that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent,
but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.*
