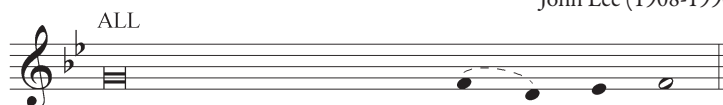

Distribution of Holy Communion

- + **Communion is given only in the hand.**
- + **Maintain six feet of separation between household groups as you come forward.**
- + **Wear your mask. Hold your hands out as flat as possible so that the minister can easily put the host on your open palm without touching your hand.**
- + **After receiving Holy Communion, lower your mask with one hand, put the host in your mouth, and then put your mask back on.**

ST VINCENT DE PAUL ASKS FOR YOUR CONTINUING SUPPORT DURING THESE CHALLENGING TIMES. The pandemic has not stopped your Cathedral Vincentians from helping our neighbors in need. During the first three months of 2021, your donations allowed us to assist 202 residents of St James parish who lack sufficient income to pay essential living expenses. That's a monthly average of over 67 people helped financially and with referrals to other possible sources of help. Even more people need help. Over 99% of our financial assistance helped pay rent. The eviction moratoriums in Seattle are set to end June 30. Most experts expect they will end then or later this year. When they end, many will face eviction if they cannot pay as little as one month's rent. And others will have built up a large debt of unpaid rent over months. This year marks the 100th anniversary of the Society of St Vincent de Paul at St James Cathedral – a good time to make a special gift of \$100 to SVdP, if you can afford it. But we are thankful for any amount you can give, and each year donors give us amounts ranging from \$1 to \$10,000 or more. 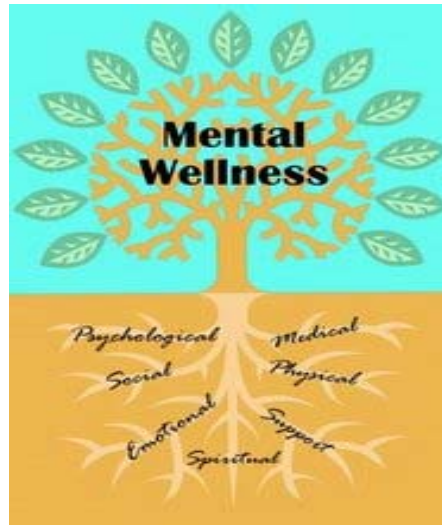

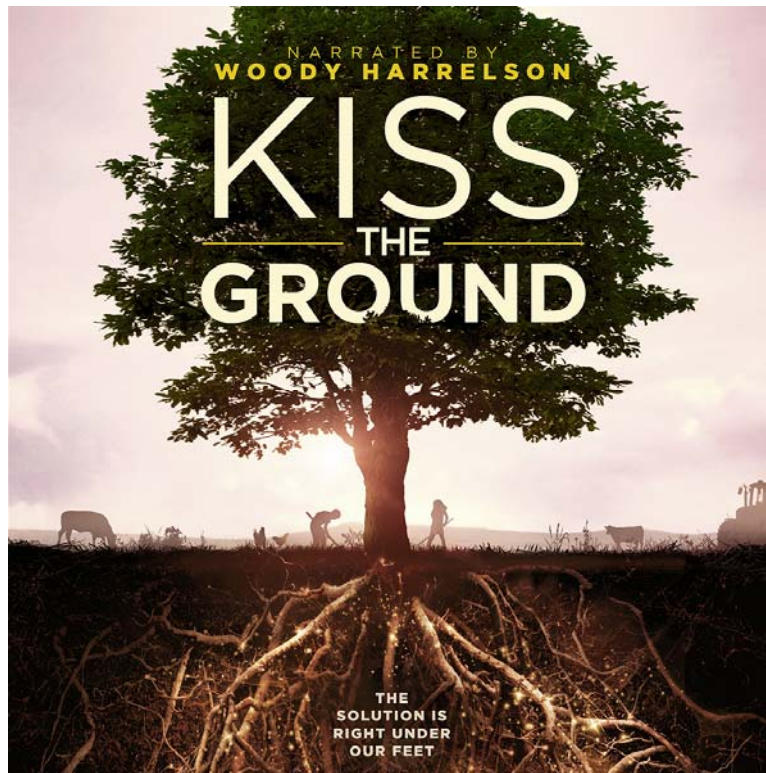
