ST. JAMES CATHEDRAL KITCHEN Every weeknight at 4pm, a small corps of Cathedral staff and volunteers serves dinner for 100 men and women. At the moment, we are able to welcome up to 18 people to come into Cathedral Hall to enjoy their dinner, but most of our guests prefer to take their dinners to go. The Cathedral Kitchen is open almost every weeknight of the year, even on most holidays. The only day that dinner is not served is Christmas Day, but a huge feast is offered on Christmas Eve to celebrate the festive season.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL THANKS YOU A young woman lost her staff job at a local hospital last year due to COVID-related layoffs. Her savings kept her afloat less than three months. Unemployment benefits were delayed starting, and at least one payment failed to arrive. She received some federal stimulus money, but at least one of those payments never showed up. She was actively looking for but not finding a new job. Yet she refused to complain, saying her family in another state "is broker than I am." Her kind landlord allowed her to pay whatever she could on rent each month, but most of the rent went unpaid while her large rent debt kept growing. After many months living this way, she called the SVdP Helpline (206-767-6449).
