CARE FOR CREATION TIP Tomorrow, Monday, April 22, is Earth Day! The Catholic Climate Covenant encourages all of us to heed Pope Francis' call to no longer be a throwaway culture. For this Earth Day, we are focusing on plastics. Consider how you can minimize your reliance on plastic. Buy produce that is not packaged in plastic. Purchase items in glass jars and bottles instead of plastic. Buy bars of soap instead of plastic pump bottles. Use laundry soap sheets rather than large plastic containers. Finally, say no to bottled water, and opt for reusable steep water bottles.

A young woman worked two part-time jobs in food service so she could cover her expenses. When she placed the application for her apartment, she hoped to get a subsidy for her rent. However, the application included a formula that automatically added an amount of tips based on her hours of work in food service. The young woman did not come close to making the level of income forecast by the formula and she strained to meet her rent expense set by the application. After a business closure, she lost one part-time job and the woman was unable to meet her rent.
