

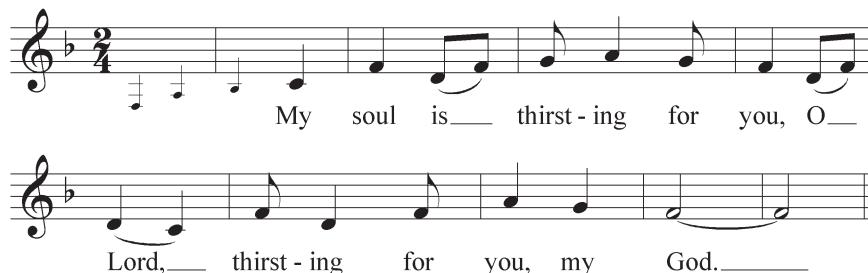



- **Ask your child to retell the Nativity story in their own words.** If they are young, you can take dictation. If they are older, encourage them to write it themselves.
- **We are also seeking original art work by your child depicting the Nativity story.** This can be any scene from the Nativity story (for example: the Annunciation, Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, Jesus in the manger, the shepherds, the three wise men following the star, etc.). **Artwork can be in any medium/format.** Submit the original or a good scan/photograph. As many as possible will be included in *In Your Midst*, and all will be displayed at the parish during the month of December (location, TBD).
- **Please be sure your child's name and age are on their writing and on the back of their artwork so we can credit them!** We will only publish their first names and age, no other identifiers.
