WORLD REFUGEE DAY, JUNE 20, 2023 World Refugee Day draws global attention to the plight of millions of refugees—individuals forcibly displaced from their homes due to various forms of conflict, violence, or persecution. The Catholic Church champions a clear message of compassion and solidarity, which is rooted in its call to “welcome the stranger.” The U.S. Bishops partnered with Princeton University to create an oral history archive that features the stories of more than 165 migrants who were forced to flee from their homes and whom eventually found their way to the United States. These stories provide insights into the challenges that these migrants face every day, the fortitude they demonstrate to overcome these obstacles, and their experiences starting a new life. JUNETEENTH: A History

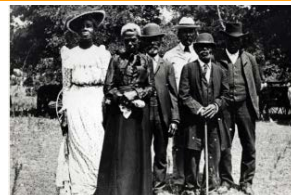
1865

Enslaved African Americans in Texas were told they were free during a public reading of General Order #3 by Major General Gordon Granger. This was more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation.



1866

The first official Juneteenth celebrations took place in Texas which included prayer meetings, and singing of spirituals representing their newfound freedom. The date continues to be the oldest tradition honoring the end of slavery in the United States.



1968

Solidarity Rally held in Washington, DC on Juneteenth boasted more than 50,000 participants in 6 weeks during which activists raised awareness of inequality. It is believed this led participants to host and celebrate Juneteenth in their communities in the years and decades that followed.



1980

Juneteenth became a state holiday in Texas and a number of other states. It is also recognized outside of the US to recognize the end of slavery and to honor the culture and achievements of African Americans.



1994

The first known movement to make Juneteenth a federal holiday began and the first congressional resolution recognizing it was introduced.



2020

The 116th Congress introduced H.Res. 1001 on June 15, which led to the introduction of the first Juneteenth National Independence Day Act.



2021

On February 25th, H.R. 1320 and S. 475 were both introduced to establish Juneteenth as a federal holiday. S. 475 passed the Senate unanimously and H.R. 1320 passed by a vote of 415-14.



President Biden signed legislation on June 17, 2021 into law that made Juneteenth, which falls on June 19, a federal holiday, after interest in the day was renewed during the summer of 2020 and the nationwide protests that followed the police killings of Black Americans including George Floyd and Breonna Taylor. It is the first holiday to be added to the list of federal holidays since the recognition of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr's birthday in 1983.

A CALL TO ACTION

Before we can celebrate Juneteenth, we as a country must do better at living into its promise.

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from the inhumane and long-term effects of systemic racism.

We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

So, on Juneteenth, we recommit to the work that needs to be done for reconciliation to address and correct our participation in unjust structures. To fully embody our belief in the life and dignity of every human person.

And, while we persist in these endeavors, we do not forget our mission to meet our community's immediate needs in the Archdiocese of Seattle offering care, food, shelter and other services to all who require it.

Every day, let us honor the dignity in every person and work to fulfill the promise of Juneteenth.
