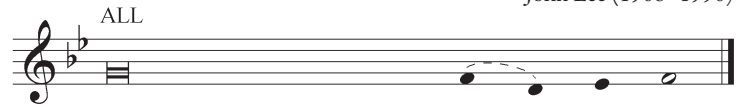



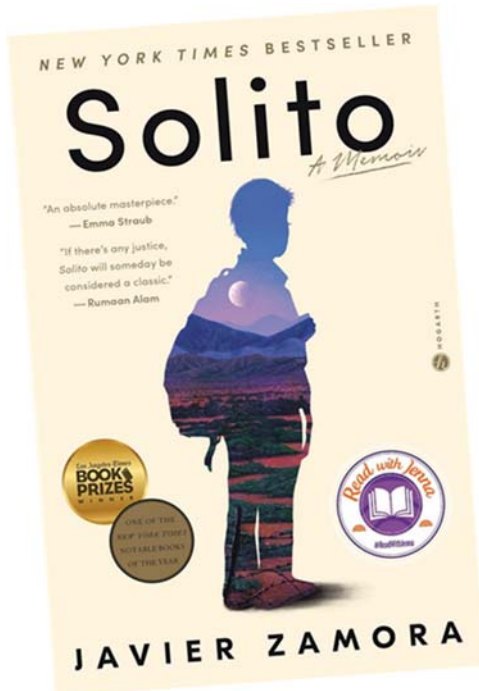

A young poet tells the inspiring story of his migration from El Salvador to the United States at the age of nine, in a gripping tale of bravery and perseverance, to find his family.

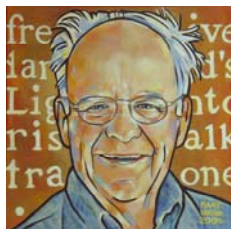

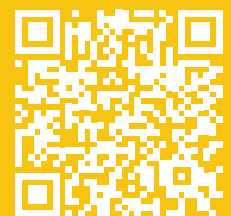
